

WILD WATCH

SCENTLESS CHAMOMILE

(TRIPLEUROSPERMUM INODORUM)



Weed Control Act Designation -

Noxious (must control). This plant is an annual, biennal, or short-lived perennial that is native to Eurasia.

Habitat -

Widespread throughout Alberta. Adapted to heavy clay soils, but is tolerant of a wide range of conditions, including flooding and dry sites.

Identification -

Solitary daisy-like flowers with white petals surrounding a yellow centre at the branch ends. Basal rosette produced in first stage of growth, flowering stem in second. Leaves are alternate, very finely divided, (carrot-like) and highly branched. Stems are highly branched, slightly reddish and up to 1 m tall or as small as 5 cm. Fibrous roots.

Control -

Reproduces by seed. Hand-pulling or herbicide, cultivation of rosettes, mowing (may regrow from roots) or biocontrol agents (a seed-head feeding weevil, and a gall midge).

More Tick Information

TICKS IN ALBERTA

- Common ticks: Rocky Mountain wood tick, Blacklegged (deer) tick (Lyme disease carrier)
- Appearance: Small, reddish-brown, eight-legged; swells after feeding
- Habitat: Grassy, wooded areas
- Body check areas: Knees, underarms, waist, scalp, ears, groin
- Removal: Use tweezers, pull straight out, clean area, save tick for ID


PROGRAM:

Integrated Vegetation Management in Action!

Our crews are hard at work this summer, spraying noxious weeds and brush along ditches to maintain clear, safe roadsides—**We're in Area 1.**

But that's just the beginning! We're expanding our weed control strategy with some innovative tools:

- **Goat Grazing:** A herd of goats will be targeting invasive vegetation in select areas.
- **Biological Control:** Leafy spurge beetles have been released to help reduce leafy spurge populations.



From controlling brush to suppressing weeds and supporting biodiversity, each effort contributes to safer travel, healthier ecosystems, and more resilient agricultural land.

F A R M F R E S H F E A S T Lemon Raspberry Cookies

Ingredients:

- 1 ¾ cups gluten-free flour
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup unsalted butter, softened
- ¾ cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ cup fresh raspberries, mashed
- ½ cup white chocolate chips (optional)

Directions:

- 1.Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C) and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2.In a medium bowl, whisk together the gluten-free flour, baking soda, and salt.
- 3.In a separate bowl, beat the butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 4.Add the egg, lemon zest, lemon juice, and vanilla extract. Mix until combined.
- 5. Gradually add the dry ingredients, stirring until just incorporated.
- 6.Gently fold in the mashed raspberries and white chocolate chips (if using).
- 7. Scoop tablespoon-sized portions of dough onto the baking sheet, spacing them about 2 inches apart.
- 8. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until the edges are lightly golden.
- 9. Allow cookies to cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire
